DRAFT LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

MINUTES of the MEETING of the LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL held on March 7th 2019, at 7:30pm at North Downs Primary School.

- 1. Apologies for absence: DCC C Osborne-Patterson, DCC Mary Huggins.
- 2. The Minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on February 7th 2019 were signed as a true record by AK.
- 3. Disclosure of Interests both AK and PW declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 14, the request by the Apple Press Group to add Apple Trees to the Allotments.
- 4. Report from PCSO had been received, covering incidents from 5th January to end of Feb. AK ran through the crime summary in the report: Criminal Damage £5000 or Less and Malicious Damage; Dog has been on farm worrying life stocking causing death of two sheep; Road Traffic Injury. Single vehicle Road Traffic Collision along Flanchford Road; Burglary Residential. Shellwood Road.
- 7:35pm SA arrived. He declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 14.
- 5. Parishioners Questions.
 - 5.1. Regarding the ditch near the corner of Bunce Common Rd and Newdigate Rd. The water runs away in opposite directions from the corner. This is why there has never been a join in the ditch. The tunnel under the gate way needs rodding.
 - 5.2. Regarding the grass cutting on the recreation ground. In 2018 the grass was kept long at the edges, this is not helpful for dog walkers and children. There is often dog waste in the long grass. Can it be cut shorter to the edge?
 - 5.2.1. ACTION check with RS at the cricket club as to their plans. (LM)
 - 5.3. Regarding the electricity certificate for the container on the recreation ground.
 - 5.3.1. ACTION chase for a copy (LM)
 - 5.4. The 30mph sign on Flanchford Bridge is missing.
 - 5.4.1. ACTION notify Surrey Highways (LM).

Community

- 6. Footpath Officers report. The gateway work on the driveway up to the pavilion is still outstanding. Contractor has been unwell and has not been able to do it yet. It will be done as soon as possible. (RW).
- 7. New website. The Monitoring Officer at MVDC has confirmed that the URL for a Parish council does not have to be in the format gov.uk. The website can use org.uk if more suitable. This is definitely easier and can be done quickly. It was agreed that the need for individual and PC related email addresses for GDPR would need further investigation and thought.
- 8. Leigh Plant Sale and The Flower Show & Country Fair 2019. The requests to use the Parish Council land have been received in writing from LDCGS for the two events.
 - 8.1. Subject to risk assessments and public liability insurance all Parish Councillors agreed to the request.

 8.2. ACTION inform LDGCS of the outcome (LM)
- 9. Litter pick 9th March at 10am all to meet on the Green as usual. Number expected are to be shared with the Seven Stars who have kindly agreed to provide refreshments for the litter pickers. AK and RW to put out the warning signs in advance and ME will collect the bags and collate them on the gravel. MVDC are to arrange for the rubbish bags to be collected from the Gravel driveway on Monday. Public Liability insurance has been upped to cover 25 pickers.
- 10. Leigh Post editor vacancy. Robert Stephenson has notified everyone that he will step down as editor from October 2019. Anne Lloyd will also be leaving. Rob Kenyon was invited to speak. The Church is struggling to replace RS but they may have a possible solution. With a couple of volunteers, the workload is not arduous and a volunteer community team would be ideal. There may be also be an opportunity to combine the paper copy with an online one, or an existing newsletter. The paper copy is still important though. This would be continuing a community magazine, supported by the church. There is a responsibility to the current advertisers. The current contracts would need to be honoured and advertisers would need to know the status by October.

10.1. ACTION – advertise the vacancy and its importance via facebook, eNewsletter and any other formats. (LM/AK)

11. Leigh in Bloom 2019. The Parish entry has been submitted to Parishes in Bloom 2019. Ideas for this year were discussed and included: involving the Plough and the Stars, provide old butler sinks for Leigh Lollipops to plant up. Current improvements year to year are the fingerpost sign, the crocuses on the green, perimeter clearing on the village green, the new stile/row gate and improvements in the playground.

Highways

- 12. Stile Access to Recreation ground progress. The component parts for the new kissing gate has been ordered. It is to be delivered care of Mike Everitt. The Surrey County Council volunteer working group is planned to install it on 1st April.
- 13. Bend at Ashurst Farm (SA). SA had made observations on the bend:
 - The bollards are dirty mainly due to the water and mud splashing up on to their reflectors. Their
 positioning on the sharp bend makes cleaning them incredibly dangerous.
 - There are no cautionary signs on the South Bend for the traffic.
 - The lines are faded. There is little point in repainting the North bound edges as they will get covered with surface dirt. There may be merit in repainting the central line from Mynthurst down to the corner. There are no cats-eyes and the line is, again, very faded.
 - Rose Bungalow borders Smallshill Road. It has had a new larch lap fence installed where the hedgerow
 had been. It is possible this will affect the sightline of driver coming out from Dean Oak Lane.

SA recommended the following:

- Renew the cats-eyes
- Paint a SLOW sign on the road approx. 200 yards for South bound traffic.
- Road needs resurfacing as the channels are very dug up and the road surface is very rough.
- The whole area needs a common-sense approach.

SCC Clack asked if this information regarding Ashurst had been fed into Surrey Highways. AK informed her that it had and they were in contact with Mr Knox. Cllr Clack offered to raise it herself with Surrey Highways.

Amenities

- 14. Allotments matters arising
 - 14.1. There had been a request from a metal detectorist to have permission to detect on the Allotments. LM had spoken to other parishes regarding their experiences. The potential complications were discussed including the need for a contract, public liability insurance and the fact that he would not be able to dig on the plots. It was agreed that this would not be taken any further and that access would be declined at this time.
 - 14.2. Ms C Kinloch was asked to speak to those present regarding the Apple Press Groups request to plant apple trees in the allotments. Many apple species have been lost so if possible, Surrey species will be planted. The trees will be small, semi dwarfing varieties (M26). Those selected will be good at coping with alternating wet and dry sites. The addition of the apples will provide juicing apples for the group and also an opportunity to extend skill learning sessions to the community. The site was discussed. The wooded area on the plot is the area being proposed. There would be a maximum of 6 trees planted with 7 to 8 metres between each tree. JC asked if there were any cons or problems potentially. That they don't survive the wet location and the birds! It was agreed that the Parish Councillors would need to see a plan of what is being proposed and potentially have a site meeting before any decisions could be made. There should be no detraction from the original purpose of the site.
 - 14.3. ACTION send through an up to date plan of the allotments to C Kinloch. (LM)
 - 14.4. **ACTION arrange a site meeting (LM)**
- 15. Review Playground inspection report (RT). The playground group met recently to identify what could be achieved in a working group day. A list had been created for the 29th March. The focus will be on the fort. Removing the tunnel, snagging and replacing it with a slide. The group are also looking to order a new double seesaw.
- 16. Harrington Close boundary site visit. On inspection it was felt that the tree work required was more like £2K worth of work. Clarion have pushed back stating that Burleys advised them that the land should be being managed by the Parish Council. The Council discussed the small working party meeting on 16th March to clear

the brambles encroaching on the village green. This would help identify the area that Clarion should be managing.

17. Noticeboard replacement – two boards to be ordered as soon as possible. (LM)

- 18. Horsehill drill site application is still open for comments. AK had circulated the objection letter written by Norwood Hill Residents Association. Councillors had agreed by email to support them. There had been further lobbying after the earthquakes and a causal link. AK mentioned that MP Crispin Blunt had been very supportive in his blog asking for more to be done.
