NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

Construction of a small South-West extension and carrying out West end internal alterations, to improve accessibility and provide a toilet and teapoint. The works will involve: Removing a section of existing 1890s wall and reconstructing it on the line of the external buttresses (including reinstatement of existing features such as plinth and window), the relocation of an altar frontals chest and book of remembrance, the insertion of a modern partition to enclose a WC toilet cubicle, and the provision of a kitchenette (refreshments point) behind a bifold timber door with wall and base cupboard units; The re-laying of the West porch floor to enable level access into the church. All as described in the following documents:

(A) Statement of Significance, and Design & Access Statement, from Roderick Maclellan Architects;

(B) Statement of Needs;

(C) two sets of photographs, from Roderick Maclellan Architects;

(D) five drawings from Roderick Maclellan Architects, ref GA02B and GA01E dated 14-08-2020, GA04B dated 30-08-2020, SK11 dated 26/05/2020, and SK10C dated 01-06-2020;

(E) Specification from Roderick Maclellan Architects dated July 2020;

(F) an email dated 16 September 2020 to the DAC Secretary from Peter Joyce and Roderick Maclellan.

so that your letter reaches the registrar not later than 16/12/2020. A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.

Directions to petitioner

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
