LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES DRAFT

MINUTES of the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL held on Monday 18th September 2023 at 7:30pm at The Pavilion, Leigh Recreation Ground.

Present Cllrs: Ms Joanne Willoughby (Chair), Mr Mark Foulsham, Mr P Wilkinson (Vice), Mr G Brockwell and Mr R Tomkins.

Also, present: Mrs Laura Mann (clerk) and Mr R Worth (Footpath Officer)

Parishioners: 3.

- 414. Apologies for absence had been received by Mr Mike Everett & Cllr Farrar-Astrop
- 415. **The Minutes of the Full Council Meeting** held on Monday 17th July 2023 were approved and signed by Cllr Willoughby. Clerk had amended an incorrect recording of no parishioners, there had in fact been 3.
- 416. **Disclosure of Interests** if any and any changes to Register of Interests. None noted.
- 417. Parishioners Questions
 - 417.1. Resident asked whether a decision had been made on how to spend the Parish Council Community Infrastructure Levy money. It was agreed that the best meeting should focus on this in November, feeding into the Budget Setting meeting held in late November. This would allow the information to be shared in the next edition of the Leigh Post.
 - 417.1.1. ACTION: publicise the next meeting where possible to generate interest and ensure as much public engagement as possible. (LM)
- 418. **Crime Report (Appendix A)** The crime report and incident list was shared. The clerk informed the Council that she had had a positive response from the request that a Rural Crime Officer attend a meeting. She is awaiting confirmation of a date. A resident had noted a car was parked on Flanchford Road regularly with the owner often in it. It was unclear as to whether they were rough sleeping or not. Ms Kinloch kindly agreed to investigate with MVDC.
- **419. Clerk Report/Matters Arising (Appendix B)** There had been no progress on the land adoption as there needs further investigating into whether the green was registered as a 'Village Green'. The clerk is going to speak with the previous clerk to see if she knows more.
- **420. Focus of meeting: Open Spaces.** Due to the volume of planning applications, it was agreed that this item be postponed as there was no requirement for decisions.
- 421. Community
 - **421.1. Grants received. There had been no grants received.** A resident informed the Parish Council that a local resident was likely to be in touch as they are looking for funding to help them set up a sport group.
- 422. Highways and Services
 - **422.1. Gatwick update.** The Development Consent Order was now being rolled out by Gatwick as part of the process of applying to bring the Emergency Runway into regular service. A publicity flyer had been received by residents in Leigh and other areas produced by Gatwick Airport, to publicise and promote the benefits they felt would be achieved. MVDC have now response to the application, pulling them up on areas of concern for locals. Stakeholders, including LPC have until the 29th October to respond to this stage of the planning process. It was acknowledged that the various lobby groups would be looking for funding in the next 12-18 months and the Council agreed that this would be sensible to support and will be discussed in the near future.
 - 422.1.1. ACTION: Circulate the MVDC response to the GIAS application (LM)
 - **422.2. Transport and roads.** Cllr Brockwell informed the Council that the school had recently had police officers in to talk to the school community about the parking issues in the immediate area. SCC Clack had kindly contacted the School Safety Team and hopefully this along with lots of people lobbying the police has resulted in them taking an interest. As the Leigh site of North Downs School has different cohorts each year it is sensible to raise the issue each year in September at the start of the school year.
 - 422.3. The speed cable strips have not been requested yet as the location has not been finalised. Cllr Wilkinson has kindly offered to send through the two sites.
- 423. Amenities

423.1. **Playground.** A local contractor has agreed to quote and complete the works on the most recent playground inspection. Finding a contractor has proven difficult as the playground is ageing. Cllr Tomkins also had a local person who was very happy to do smaller jobs.

There had been recent incidents reported of excessive littering and dog waste in the park. It was noted that the dog waste bin was overflowing, and litter had been put next to the bin again.

423.1.1. ACTION: circulate the quote once in (LM)

- **423.2. Allotments.** An allotment holder has requested permission to put a small shed on her plot. Cllrs discussed and agreed to decide shortly, in the absence of Cllr Everett. Decision to be circulated by email and communicated with the leaseholder. The clerk proposed that she share a topline profit and loss of the maintenance of the allotments with plot holders, for their information. All agreed this would be useful.
- **423.3. Open spaces.** Cllr Brockwell informed the council that the Carman family memorial bench was now in place on the green. The clerk thanks Cllr Brockwell for his work on this. The History Group bench was still a work in progress. Once they have more to share, Ms Kinloch will inform the clerk. It was noted that there had been no additional cuts made to the recreation ground, boundary grass. The clerk will investigate with the contractor.
